Further to this you may wish to make an appointment to speak to our Head Teacher.

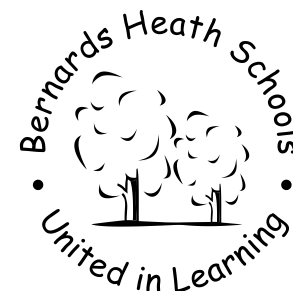
